IV. Presentation

- STEM Scholars ProgramLisa Shin
Heartland Educational Consortium

Lisa Shin, Heartland Educational Consortium, presented information regarding the STEM Scholars Program. The STEM program recognizes the need for students in small and rural districts to receive enhanced instruction in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. This is the 5th year of the program at Okeechobee High School and the Freshman Campus. The program was initially funded through a grant and is now funded by the local School Boards in the Consortium. The program provides more rigorous STEM courses, STEM Forums, and Summer Challenges at universities. Also provided are two parent nights per year for Okeechobee High School and the Freshman Campus. Ms. Shin introduced three local students: Kalysta Fowler (9th Grade), Jarred Schoonmaker (10th Grade), and Jennifer Center (11th Grade). The students spoke to the Board about their experiences in the STEM program.

A. SUPERINTENDENT

- In accordance with a requirement of F.S. 1008.22 (10)(b)1., Superintendent Kenworthy reported to the School Board that the District has one child with a properly documented medical complexity who will not be participating in the District's assessment program.
- The last onsite session for Master Board training will be on Monday, March 21, 2016, at 4:00 p.m. in the Superintendent's office.
- The Pre-Application for Special Facilities funding to rebuild Okeechobee High School was denied at this time. The Pre-Application Committee's consensus was that the project is not a critical need and provided a list of suggested improvements/repairs for extending the life of the campus. The District will be permitted to reapply at a later date for the funding for Special Facilities.
