Brown and I have served on the Illini Bluffs Board of Education for eight years. During those eight years as a board member I have served as the board president for six years. Prior to my being elected to the board I served as the high school principal for ten years in the Illini Bluffs School district.

Dr. Light came to our district from Georgia and in essence was coming back home. His parents lived in Bartonville and he wanted to move closer to them.
