IV. Request to Address Board

Tracy Sills

Mrs. Sills said she was speaking on behalf of herself and other guidance counselors. Mrs. Sills stated that Guidance Counselors need support and assistance as their duty and responsibility is greater than that of a teacher. A Guidance Counselor must attend many evening events in addition to crisis calls, including the monitoring of student information over the summer and this is more responsibility than is covered by the guidance counselor's salary. The Union negotiated last year for a Guidance Counselor Task Force to discuss options. The Task Force determined that a Testing Coordinator was needed to assist guidance counselors. Mrs. Sills said something happened and the Testing Coordinator was not hired. She asked Board members take a different look at the Guidance Counselor's added work, responsibility, evening events and the nature of the work; Mrs. Sills feels they warrant support or a supplement. Member Arnold stated that the Legislature did not allow the Testing Coordinator to be funded this year. The Board would look at a long term plan for that position, possibly funding next fiscal year. Vice Chair Holcomb asked if the added position of Graduation Coach took some of the testing responsibility from the guidance counselors. Mrs. Sills said it did not take any of the work away, guidance counselors must still meet with parents, etc. Mrs. Sills also stated that the Graduation Coach position is not necessary; if a Testing Coordinator is hired Guidance Counselors could do the work of the Graduation Coach. Guidance Counselors are still responsible for crisis calls, even though a Social

Worker is on campus. Referrals must be made to two individuals, so the crisis position does not take work away from the Guidance Counselor.

Superintendent Kenworthy stated that in April the allocation was based on a budget that could afford to give the position. However, the House budget was approved and took away the position. A Learning Resource Specialist has been placed at most schools, Algebra II has been taken away legislatively, and Districts have asked the Legislature to back off assessments. Mr. Kenworthy said that he would check into the Graduation Coach not doing any testing as that is in the job description. The Superintendent also stated that a Testing Coordinator will not solve all problems, as Guidance Counselors are key and will still be involved in the process. A Testing Coordinator cannot go through every file for every student. Member Arnold asked if staffing allocations are different at high schools to balance the work load. Is there something creative at other schools?

- The Required Local Effort millage is set by the state at 4.358, a decrease of 0.246 mills from last year, and is expected to generate \$7,880,756.00 which is an increase of \$33,179.00.
- The maximum Discretionary Local Effort millage rate of 0.748 is also set by the state and is expected to generate \$1,352,640.00, an increase of \$77,664.00. Levying this Local Effort millage makes the District eligible to receive Millage Compression funding from the state.
- The Capital Improvement Effort millage is unchanged from last year at 1.50 mills and is expected to yield an estimated \$2,712,514.00, an increase of \$155,745.00.
- The total local tax receipts for the Operating Fund are expected to be \$9,233,396.00, an increase of \$110,843.00 over last year's receipts. The total combined tax receipts, including Capital Improvement, are \$11,945,910.00 which is an increase of \$266,588.00 from last year.
