That the Board approve amendment of School Board Policy 6.43 <u>Unlawful Discrimination Prohibited</u> to prohibit discrimination on the basis of pregnancy in education and employment.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The proposed amendment is required to comply with Senate Bill 982, Florida statutes, and federal law. Advertisement of intent to amend Policy 6.43 was approved by the School Board on September 10, 2015, and legally advertised to the public on July 24, 2015, as required by Chapter 120, Administrative Procedures Act, Florida Statutes. Policy 6.45, with revisions noted, is attached and is available upon request in the Superintendent's office.

6.43+

UNLAWFUL DISCRIMINATION PROHIBITED

POLICY

- I. No person shall, on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, <u>pregnancy</u>, age, national or ethnic origin, genetic information, political beliefs, marital status, sexual orientation, disability, if otherwise qualified, social and family background, or on the basis of the use of a language other than English by Limited English Proficiency (LEP) students, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity, or in any employment conditions or practices conducted by this School District, except as provided by law.
- II. The School Board shall comply with all federal and state laws which include the Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), as amended by the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA), Title IX, Section 504, Florida Education Equity Act, Age Discrimination in Employment Act (ADEA), Genetic Information Non-Discrimination Act of 2008 (GINA), and the Boy Scouts of America Equal Access Act.
- III. Any employee, student, applicant for admissions, or applicant for employment who believes he/she has been discriminated against or has been harassed by another employee, student, or third party is encouraged to use the Equity Plan Grievance Procedure for filing complaints. Complaints may be filled with the principal or immediate supervisor, District Equity Coordinator/Director of Human Resources, or the Superintendent.
- IV. The Superintendent shall develop procedures to notify employees, applicants for employment, and students regarding their rights under this policy.

SUBJECT: ADVERTISEMENT TO AMEND BOARD POLICY 5.50 STUDENT RECORDS

DATE: October 13, 2015

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board approve advertisement to amend Board Policy 5.50 <u>Student Records</u> and that the revisions be included in the <u>Student Educational Records Manual</u>.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The proposed revision of Board Policy 5.50 aligns the policy with current statutes regarding:

- Annual notification to parents and students of their rights regarding education records
- The non-collection or retention of information including biometric information which is restricted by 1002.222, F.S.
- Release of confidential and exempt student information authorized by 1002.221, F.S.
- Use of student Social Security numbers until the Department of Education issues a student identification number.

STUDENT RECORDS

POLICY

School Board rules and procedures for maintaining student records shall be consistent with Florida Statutes, State Board of Education rules, and federal laws relating to Family Educational and Privacy Rights and Privacy Rights of Parents and Students. The Superintendent shall be responsible for interpreting this rule and the school principal shall be responsible for controlling and supervising student records, following all rules on student records, and interpreting rules on student records to the school staff, students, and the community.

- I. Procedures on student records shall be approved by the School Board and contained in the Student Educational Records Manual. The provisions of the No Child Left Behind Act requirements relating to the surveying of students, the collecting of information from students for marketing purposes, and certain nonemergency medical examinations shall be included.
- II. Parents and students shall be notified annually of their rights regarding education records.
- III. The District shall not collect or retain information including biometric information restricted by 1002.222, F.S.
- The individual records of children enrolled in the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program shall be maintained as confidential records exempt from the public records law as required by Florida Statutes.
- A school may release a student's education records to partners to an interagency agreement among the Department of Juvenile Justice, the school, law enforcement authorities and other signatory agencies as allowed by law.
- VI. Student information that is confidential and exempt shall not be released except when authorized by 1002.221, F.S.
- IV. Social Security numbers may be collected from students:
 - A. To be used as student identification numbers as required allowed by 1008.386, F.S. until the Department of Education has issued a student identification number;
 - B. To facilitate the processing of student scholarships, college admission and other applications; and
 - C. For other purposes when consent of the parent or adult student is granted as allowed by law.

APPROVAL TO TEMPORARILY EXCEED MAXIMUM CLASS SIZE

DATE:

October 13, 2015

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board approve and allow the temporary exceeding of Class Size maximums as needed and as allowed by Florida Statute 1003.03 (2)(b)(1) thru(3), which states:

1003.03. Maximum class size.

(2) IMPLEMENTATION

- (b) A student who enrolls in a school after the October student membership survey may be assigned to an existing class that temporarily exceeds the maximum number of students in subsection (1) if the district school board determines it to be impractical, educationally unsound, or disruptive to student learning to not assign the student to the class. If the district school board makes this determination:
 - 1. Up to three students may be assigned to a teacher in kindergarten through grade 3 above the maximum as provided in paragraph (1)(a);
 - 2. Up to five students may be assigned to a teacher in grades 4 through 12 above the maximum as provided in paragraphs (1)(b) and (c), respectively; and
 - 3. The district school board shall develop a plan that provides that the school will be in full compliance with the maximum class size in subsection (1) by the next October student membership survey.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The normal requirements for maximum class sizes, are:

Grades PK-3: 18 [F.S. 1003.03 (1)(a)] Grades 4-8: 22 [F.S. 1003.03 (1)(b)] Grades 9-12" 25 [F.S. 1003.03 (1)(c)]

Approval to exceed the maximum class sizes, as allowed in statute, will accommodate less disruption of the educational process by reducing the need to move students and teachers to meet class size.

The District plans to be in compliance with class size again by the October, 2016, membership survey. A copy of the statute governing class size is attached and is available upon request in the Superintendent's office.
