## VII. Information Items

#### A. <u>Superintendent</u>

- In accordance with a requirement of F.S. 1008.22 (10)(b)1., report to the Board that the District has one child with a properly documented medical complexity who will not be participating in the District's assessment program.
- Members were given the 2017 Kindergarten Round-Up flyer.
- Mr. Kenworthy reported that he visited the Douglas Brown After-School Tutoring Program
  and was pleased to see 34 student participants. The District is collecting materials for
  them to use and thanked Board members for supporting this initiative.
- Members were given flyers, "Virtual Professional Learning for School Board Members" from the Heartland Educational Consortium.
- Board members were given copies of the Blue Cross Blue Shield Okeechobee Schools Annual Report, plan period October 1, 2015 September 30, 2016. The report includes the following areas of interest: RX Performance/Prime Therapeutics Annual Pharmacy Review, Client Performance Report, Compliance Screenings, Plan Risk vs. Book by Age Bracket, Network Savings and Utilization, Payment and Utilization Indicators, Population and Member Share and High Cost Data. Superintendent Kenworthy shared that the report covers data on utilization by disease and drugs. The Payment and Utilization Indicators chart show a decrease in usage and costs in most categories. He also reported that usage of the Wellness Center is helping to hold down costs. Mr. Kenworthy also stated that the

average age of employees is decreasing and that also helps with the cost of premiums. At a recent meeting with BCBS representatives, the District received a verbal commitment that premium costs will not increase this year. The Superintendent encouraged members to read over the detailed reports.

• The August 8, School Board meeting is the same evening as Open House. The Superintendent asked the pleasure of the Board in moving the meeting. Members asked that a recommendation be brought to the next meeting changing the August meeting to the 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### B. <u>School Board Members</u>

 Member Arnold stated that he contacted the District's attorney regarding the Superintendent remaining on the same salary schedule for six years. Member Arnold recommended that the Superintendent be paid on the same schedule as elected Superintendents and that he should be recognized for his continuing education and certifications and rewarded accordingly. Mr. Arnold also recommended that with a positive evaluation an annual raise should occur unless other District salaries are frozen.

#### C. <u>School Board Attorney</u>

Mr. Conely distributed annual evaluation forms to members for the Superintendent. He
requested that the forms be completed and returned to him by the June meeting.
