That the Board ratify a Memorandum of Agreement with the Instructional Personnel Bargaining Unit to revise the weighting of the Instructional Practice Component (IPC) and the Student Growth and Achievement Component (SGA) for the 2014-15 Instructional Evaluation System.

This agreement will change the weighting of the evaluation components to:

- 66.7% Instructional Practice Component (IPC)
- 33.3% Student Growth and Achievement (SGA)

Memorandum of Agreement between The Okeechobee County Education Association #1604 and The School District of Okeechobee County

Instructional Personnel Unit

The Okeechobee County Education Association #1604 (OCEA) and the School Board of Okeechobee County (Board) have reached agreement regarding revisions to the weighting of the Instructional Practice Component (IPC) and Student Growth and Achievement (SGA) in the 2014-15 Instructional Evaluation System.

ARTICLE XII Evaluation

F. Value Added/Student Learning Growth/Gain Data

The <u>Evaluation Components</u> <u>Value Added Model (VAM)</u> will be calculated for instructional personnel as follows:

For the 2014-15 school year, the Instructional Practice Component (IPC) will comprise 66.7% of the final summative evaluation and the Student Growth and Achievement (SGA) will comprise 33.3% of the final summative evaluation.

1. Student test results (growth data) for the 2011 2012 school year will constitute year one (1) (the beginning year) for the purpose of compiling three (3) years of student growth data for teachers who teach subject areas covered by a state assessment. The 2013-14 school year will constitute year one (1) for teachers who used schoolwide or districtwide scores in previous year(s) and now have scores for the individual students they serve. For teachers who become employed by the district any time after a year one (1) implementation of any approved statewide or local district assessment, that year of employment constitutes their year one (1) for the purpose of compiling three (3) years of student growth data. When three (3) years of data is available, fifty percent (50%) of the teacher's evaluation will be based on the Instructional Practice Component (IPC) and fifty percent (50%) on student learning growth and achievement. When three (3) years of this data is not available for each teacher, the proportions will alter to 60% for IPC and 40% for student growth and achievement.

Re: Summer Work Schedule

An agreement has been reached between the Okeechobee County Education Association ("the OCEA") and the School Board of Okeechobee County ("the Board') regarding the summer work schedule for July, 2015, as follows:

July 6 – July 23: 7:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. (Monday through Thursday)

All offices will be closed Fridays: July 10, 17, 24

There will, however, be one departmental exception to the above. Due to the state requirement that public schools provide food services to summer recreational programs, members of the Food Service staff may be employed 4.5 to 6 hours/day, 5 days/week, with 4 to 5.5 hours/day paid and a 30 minute unpaid lunch, during the month of July. One paid 15-minute break shall be provided to these employees each day.

Other categories of classified employees shall work the 4-day summer work schedule as follows:

- 8-hour classified employees who normally receive a 1-hour or 30-minute unpaid lunch period during the regular 5-day work schedule shall work 9 hours per day with an hour for lunch. Thirty (30) minutes of paid break time shall be provided to these employees during their 9-hour summer workday. (Employees will work a total of 9 hours spread over 10 clock hours.)
- 7.5-hour classified employees who normally receive a 30-minute unpaid lunch period during the regular 5-day work week shall work 8 hours 30 minutes per day with an hour for lunch. Thirty (30) minutes of paid break time shall be provided to these employees during their work day. (Employees will work a total of 8.5 hours spread over 9.5 hours.)

Staff will return to the normal work schedule on Monday, July 27, 2015.

Chapter 7.00: Business Services

7.23

INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

POLICY

- I. The Superintendent shall invest temporarily idle funds to earn the maximum return for the period available while assuring minimum risk to principal. The investment objectives shall be consistent with F.S. 218.415(17). The investment objectives shall include safety of capital, liquidation of funds and investment income. Funds may be placed in the following types of investments.
 - A. Bids from qualified depositories
 - B. Financial deposit instruments insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC);
 - C. Time-deposits;
 - D. Securities of the United States Government;
 - E. State managed cooperative investment plans, or
 - F. Other forms of authorized investments. Should the district choose to enter into third-party custodial agreements, master purchase agreements or security purchase agreements, it shall do so in accordance with Section 218.415, Florida Statutes or its successor and amendments thereto. The district shall not invest in derivative products.
- II. The principal shall invest temporarily idle internal account funds in qualified depositories at the best available return while assuring minimal risk to principal and in accordance with this policy.
- III. The Board shall provide for appropriate training of those persons managing its investments.
