Continuous Improvement Two phases of the Process: Internal Review and External Review Standards for Quality: (1) Purpose and Direction; (2) Governance and Leadership; (3) Teaching and Assessing for Learning; (4) Resource and Support Systems; (5) Using Results for Continuous Improvement Benefits of District Accreditation Disadvantages of District Accreditation List of Florida Accredited Districts
	Ms. Wiersma stated that the complete process for systems accreditation takes 18 months.
	The Board had lengthy discussion regarding the advantages and disadvantages of systems accreditation. The benefits include further development of focus and common language for improvement across content areas and grade levels, bringing external vision and support to the district, and validation of what the district is doing well. The disadvantages are the additional work to achieve accreditation as well as the cost.
	Superintendent Kenworthy stated that the ability to have an outside party look at what the district is doing is confirmation to the community that the district is making every effort to increase student achievement.
	The Board discussion included the following areas:
	 Cost versus results affecting student achievement. Advantage of having outside experts take a long, deep look at what the district is doing or not doing to stimulate student learning. The accreditation process does not focus heavily on test scores and school grades, but looks specifically at how students are learning within the district. Are there other organizations that can do the same type of
	 Are there offer organizations that can do the same type of studies to help the district improve for less outlay of funds? Superintendent Kenworthy responded that there are organizations, such as FADSS, that will do studies in the district

	 that are focused in one area, but they are usually more expensive and not nearly as comprehensive as the accreditation process. Much of the accreditation process mirrors the Board's Strategic Plan which validates what is being done in the district for student achievement. Concern was voiced that the accreditation process should not be an exercise to "check a box" with few gains in student achievement. The accreditation process is successful only if the information received from the study is used in a meaningful way to increase focus and common language across content areas and all grade levels. Is the timing for system accreditation undesirable at this time considering all that teachers have been through recently with state standards? Will teachers be on board with the process? Superintendent Kenworthy responded that in surveying his Teacher Advisory Group and the District Advisory Council, the responses to pursing system accreditation were divided 50/50. Principals have commented that the feedback would be nice, but that it will take quite a bit of committee work. Does the district achieve accreditation if some schools are less successful than others? Mrs. Wiersma explained that it is an all or nothing process and outcome.

The remainder of the students and their parents will meet on March 21 and 22, 2016.

- 2. Taking Care of Your Device
- 3. Using Your Chromebook at School
- 4. Managing Files and Saving Your Work
- 5. Software on Chromebooks
- 6. Acceptable Use Policy
- 7. Protecting and Storing Your Chromebooks
- 8. User Fees, Deductibles and Repair/Replacement Costs
- 9. Chromebook Technical Support

Also included in the handbook is a Device Damage or Loss Report Form and a Parent Participation Form. The fee to participate is \$20. This will cover the first-time need to repair the Chromebook and does not cover intentional damages.

Suggestions after Board discussion were to include an opt-out option on the Parent Participation Form and providing security for Chromebooks taken to Okeechobee High School by students for gym class.
