It is the policy of the State of Florida that all state, county, and municipal records are open for personal inspection and copying by any person. Providing access to public records is a duty of each agency. That being said, certain information, such as name, address, work location, telephone number and salary is available to the public upon their request.

Florida Statute 119.071 provides exemptions from the public records law of personal information of selected individuals who are current or former officials, or relatives of current or former officials, who may be subject to retaliation from individuals who have been convicted of crimes or who have been investigated.

Social security numbers, benefit reductions, or health information are never released in response to public records requests. Social security numbers may be released to the IRS, Division of Retirement, or to your voluntary insurance provider.
